Please note that there is a change of name of the new Competition plant mentioned above.

Snowbird was a cross registered by Everglades Orchids in 1978, its parents being Odontobrassia (Odbrs.) Gordon Dillion x Oncidium obryzatum. The originator of the seedling was Norwood K Schaffer of Baltimore, USA.

Odbrs. Gordon Dillion is the primary hybrid of Brassia maculata x Odontoglossum bictoniense.

Due to all the changes that the Botanists have made because of DNA testing to the genera of so many orchids, it has been a Maclellanara, Beallara and an Aliceara over the years.

It is **NOW** a Brascidostele Snowbird or for short, a Bcd. Snowbird.

TASKS TO BE DONE AT THIS TIME OF THE YEAR IN YOUR GROWING AREAS

There are a lot of chores that can be completed at this time of the year in preparation for flowering later on in the year.

First and foremost, keep your plants free from fallen leaves and flowers. You don't need these to compost on your benches, causing a slimey mess as you continue to water over them.

Watering is vitally important with the warmer days we have been experiencing of late. I've said before, please check the forecasts from the Bureau of Meteorology to check if a morning watering is best over an evening event. If expecting a warm to hot day, do your watering in the evening prior, once the sun is set, so your plants have the best chance to hydrate overnight. You can then water the ground under your plants to keep the humidity up during the day if necessary.

A great use of old baby baths is to put them under the benches and fill them with water. Hot days will cause evaporation and assist with the humidity in the area.

Water left sitting in the leaf axis on a hot day will cause the water to even "boil", thus killing off that new growth. Not what we want for our flowering or lack thereof.

If you haven't completed your repotting and dividing in Spring, you can just pot-on into a bigger pot without disturbing the root system too much. Dividing plants in the heat of Summer is NOT recommended.

A fan can be your best investment if air circulation is a problem in closed-in areas on very warm to hot days. The same applies in winter when frosts are forecast. Keeping the air moving will be beneficial as frosts do not settle on windy nights.

Never fertilize very dry plants. Water well the day before and then you can add the fertilizer the next day.

Cymbidium flower spikes are now starting to form, so by placing a bamboo stake beside the spike helps to remind you that as it grows, you can carefully tie it to the stake as it matures. Remember that pendulous varieties are meant to be pendulous, so please don't force the issue to make them upright. The flowering will never "look right" if you do.

Remember that orchids such as *Paphiopedilums, Phalaenopsis, Disas,* or *Stenoglottis* don't have canes or bulbs to store food and water, so careful watering of those is vitally important during Summer.

Don't forget all your hanging plants as they will dehydrate very quickly without the attention of watering regularly.
